MINUTES OF VESTRY

June 20, 2012

The Vestry of St. Matthew's Episcopal Church, Benton, Arkansas, met in regular session in the fellowship hall on Wednesday, June 20, 2012 at 7:00 PM. Present were Susan Alford, Chris Ellis, Selena Ellis, Fanny Jones, Allison Nolley, Glen Poteet, and the Rev. Lorrie Slaymaker, Vicar. Also present were Melinda Hood, treasurer, and James Maddox.

The Vicar called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Evening prayer was led by James Maddox.

The minutes from the April and May meetings and the email voting regarding the RB House were unavailable at this time, but will be reviewed upon submission.

Melinda Hood presented the Financial Report for May 2012. She reported that the amount reported for the SIGN/ROOF FUND should actually show a total of \$1925. Selena Ellis made a motion to accept the amended report. The motion was seconded by Fanny Jones. The motion carried unanimously.

The Vicar presented the Attendance Reports which show that we have been doing very well for the first 5 months of the year.

NEW BUSINESS

There was discussion about the vacancy of the RB House. Fanny Jones reported that CJ Smith is interested in renting the house, but she had just made a deposit on the rental of another house with a 6 month lease. The Vestry decided to waive the first month's rent to cover the loss of the deposit if CJ is interested in renting the RB House now instead of the other house. Fanny will talk to CJ again. Fanny also knew of a new teacher at Benton Middle School that might be interested in renting the house. If CJ is going to rent the RB House, Fanny will talk to the other person. If neither of them is interested in renting the house, we will advertise in the Courier and Democrat Gazette. The rent for the house will be \$500/month.

James Maddox made a proposal to give some of the outreach money to the Rice Depot.

OLD BUSINESS

We need recipes for the new cookbook. We would like to have these complete this summer.

The ECW did very well with their "No Bake Bake Sale". They made a contribution of \$500 to the Sign Campaign.

Fanny Jones reported that Ricky is still planning to clear the understory of the woods. He is waiting for a bulldozer to be available.

Lorrie had called the Chamber of Commerce about placing an ad in their quarterly magazine. There was no space available, but they will call Lorrie when they are working on the next rotation. The cost of the ad is \$125 which includes a one- time fee of \$25 for the design of the ad.

Randy and Tyler Henderson will be working on the problems with the lighting in the church when they are available.
